## Unit Focus

- This unit focuses on Iong vowels. This unit also includes two common, high frequency words, 'continuous' and 'industrial'.


## Teaching Points

- Discuss how the silent ' $\mathbf{e}$ ' on the end of each word makes the vowel sound long: 'a-e', 'e-e', 'iee', 'o-e', and 'u-e'.
- Discuss any difficult parts of words.
- Sort the list words to the graphemes and brainstorm other words to add to each list.


## Rules

- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with ' $\boldsymbol{e}$ ', the ' $\boldsymbol{e}$ ' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- To make the plural of words ending with ' $y$ ' after a consonant, change the ' $\mathbf{y}$ ' to ' i ' and add 'es'.


## Dictation

## Unit Focus

- This unit focuses on the prefixes 'im', 'mis', and 'in'. This unit also includes two common, high frequency words, 'consequence' and 'development'.


## Teaching Points

- Discuss the meaning of each prefix.
- Identify the base word for each list word.
- Identify any smaller words that make up each word.
- Sort the list words according to the prefixes and brainstorm to add to each list.


## Rules

- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with ' $\mathbf{e}$ ', the ' $\boldsymbol{e}$ ' is dropped before adding the suffix. (The 'e' is retained in balanceable to keep the soff ' $c$ ' sound.) Note: The word 'immoveable' with the 'e' retained, generally, has a meaning related to law.
- To make the plural of words ending with ' $\mathbf{y}$ ' affer a consonant, change the ' $\mathbf{y}$ ' to ' $i$ ' and add 'es'. When adding ' $\mathbf{y}$ ' to words ending with ' $1 e^{\prime}$ ', change the ' $\mathbf{e}$ ' to ' $\mathbf{y}$ '.


## Dictation

## Teaching Points

- Discuss the meaning of each suffix.
- Identify the base word for each list word.
- Discuss any difficult parts of the words.
- Sort the list words according to the suffixes and brainstorm other words to add to each list.


## Rules

- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with 'e', the 'e' is dropped before adding the suffix.
- To make the plural of words ending with 'y' after a consonant, change the ' $\mathbf{y}$ ' to ' i ' and add 'es'.
- The ' $y$ ' at the end of base words changes to 'i' when a suffix is added.
- When a word ends with a single 'i', double the 'I' when a suffix beginning with a vowel is added.
- When adding ' $\mathbf{y}$ ' to a word ending with ' $\mathbf{e}$ ', drop the 'e' before adding ' $\mathbf{y}$ '.

- This unit focuses on the graphemes 'ci', 'si', 'ssi', 'ss' and 'ti' to represent a sound (phoneme). This unit also includes two common, high frequency words, 'happened' and 'practise'.


## Teaching Points

- Identify the phoneme and how it is represented.
- Discuss any difficult parts of words.
- Sort the list words according to the graphemes and brainstorm other words to add to each list.


## Rules

- The ' $\mathbf{y}$ ' at the end of base words changes to ' $\mathbf{i}$ ' when a suffix is added.
- To make the plural of words ending with a 'y' after a consonant, change the ' $y$ ' to ' $i$ ' and add 'es'.
- The 'y' is retained when adding 'ing' to avoid 'ii' being written. (Two exceptions are 'taxiing' and 'skiing'.)
- When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to most words ending with ' $\mathbf{e}$ ', the ' $\mathbf{e}$ ' is dropped before adding the suffix.


## Dictation
